- ✓ To develop training modules that are attractive to users with 'easy to digest solutions'.

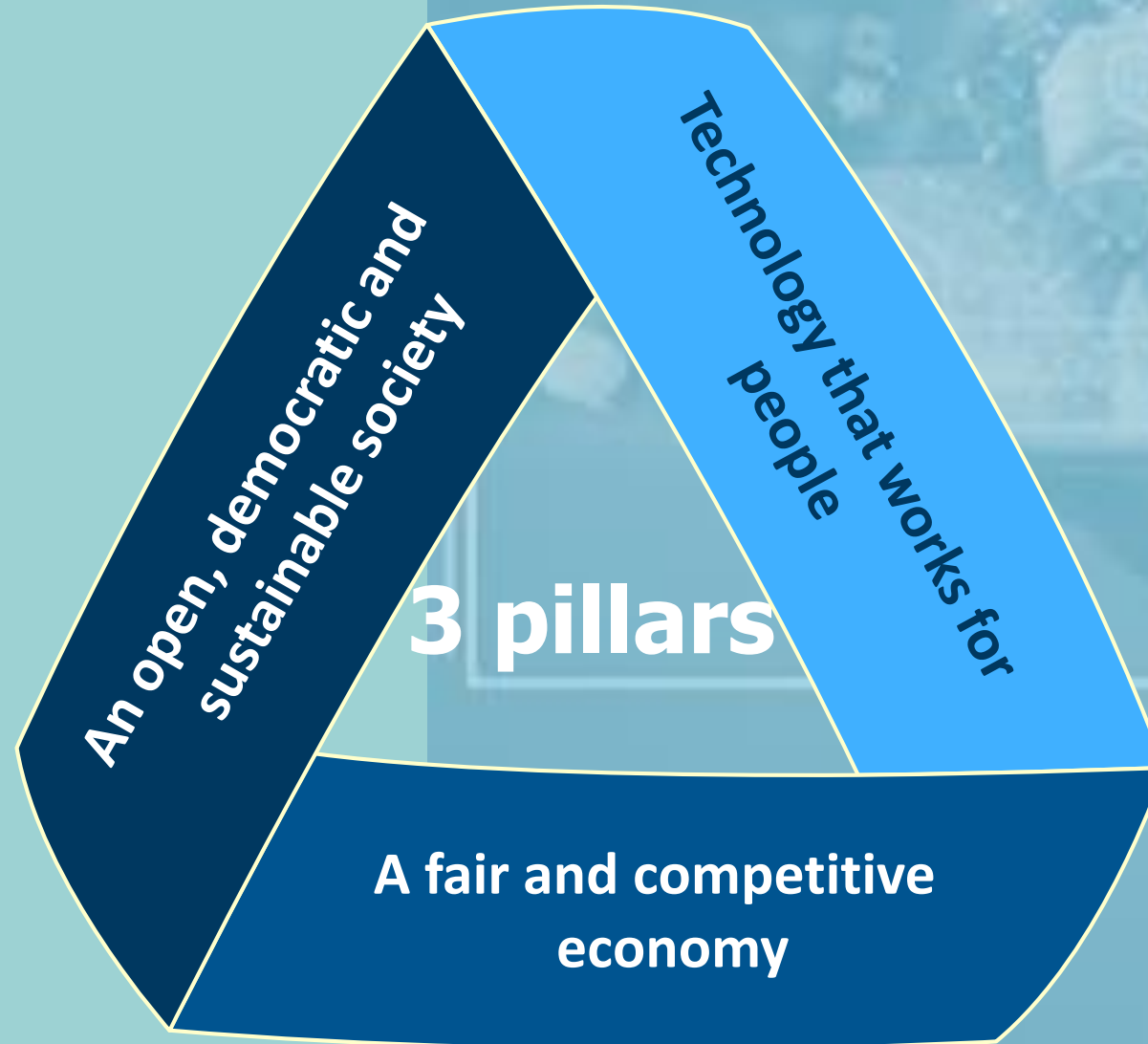

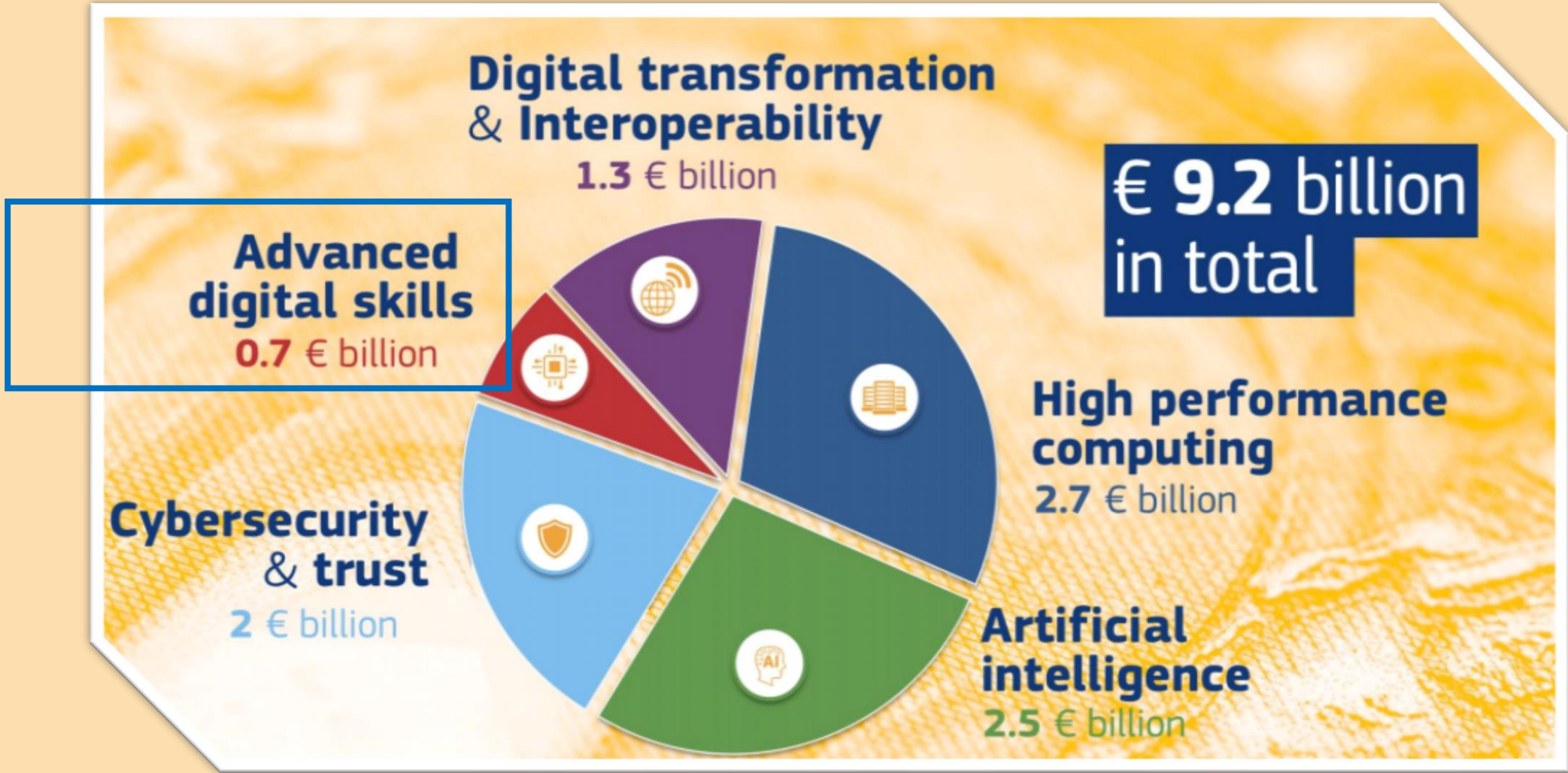

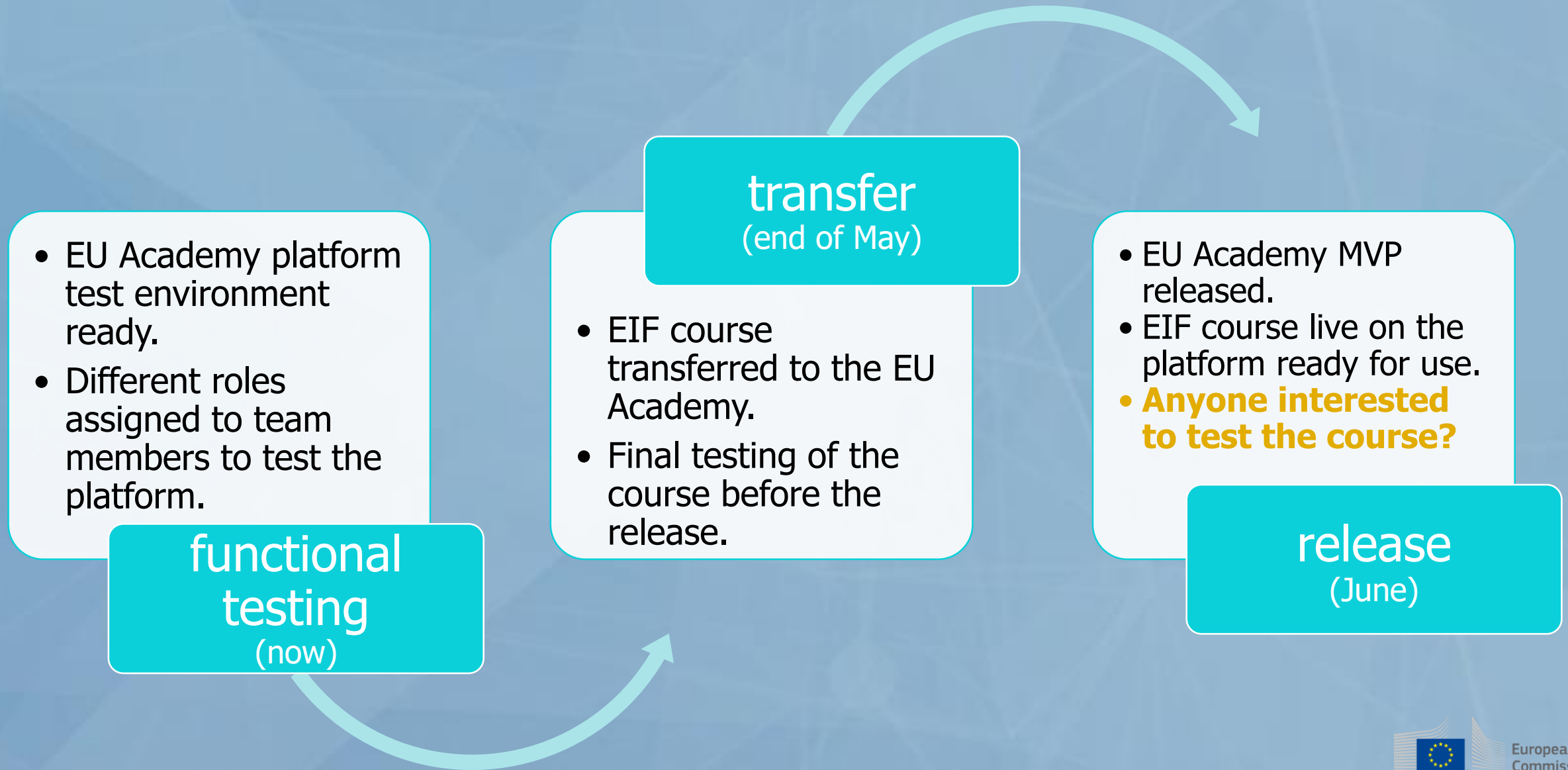

Testing of course release of the IOP Academy - timeline



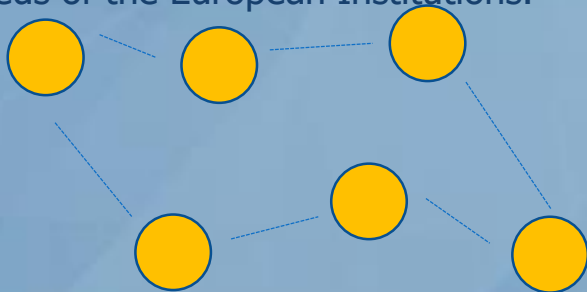

Why an EU Academy?

- Centralise the access to trainings that different EU Institutions are currently offering (currently scattered on different platforms).
- Trainings not necessarily online, but there is an increased need for e-learning
- Organise trainings and develop relevant topics, following the current priorities and needs of the European Institutions.



Vision

EU Academy is a go-to learning resource for external professionals who work at the interface between EU policy and its implementation.

Learning opportunities will take the form of self-directed e-learning modules as well as synchronous (real-time) virtual classroom events and community building activities.

Result

A GDPR-compliant world-class inter-institutional online learning platform delivering targeted high quality learning opportunities to external professionals working at the interface between EU policy and its implementation.

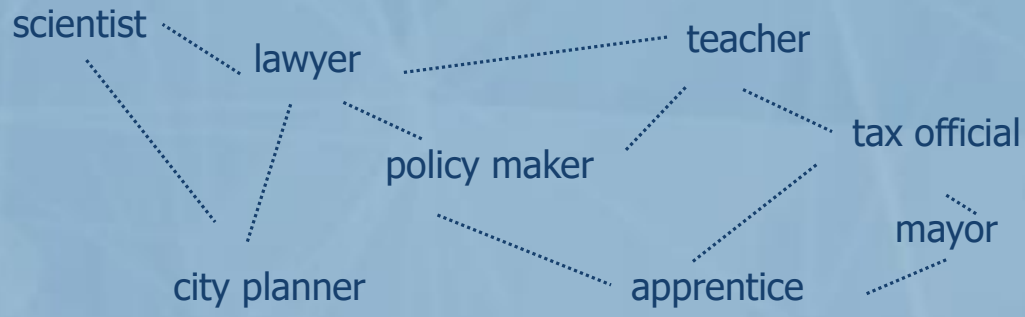

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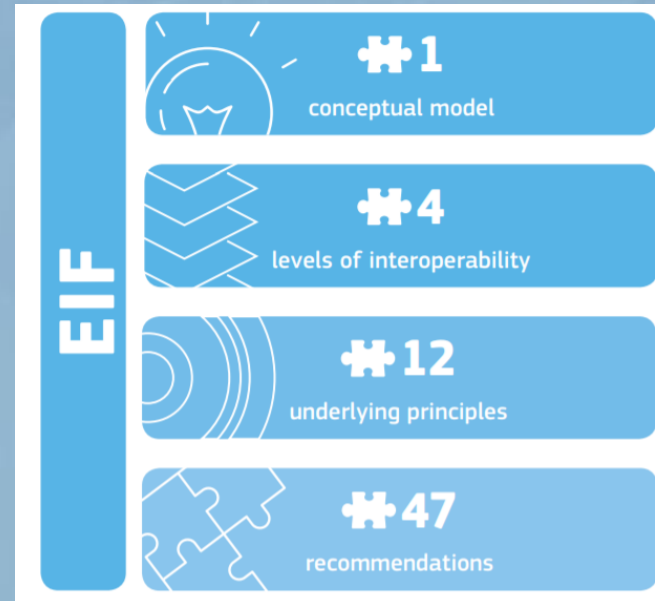

The new EIF and the role of ISA²



Role of ISA²

In accordance to ISA² decision, the ISA² programme is in charge of contributing to and monitoring the implementation of the EIF across the EU Member States.



- ✓ The **new EIF** is part of an EC Communication (2017/134) adopted in March 2017.
- ✓ The framework gives guidance on the establishment of interoperable digital public services.

Aim: Engage the target audience with the EIF in order to promote the 3 pillars (principles, layers and conceptual model) and learn how interoperability helps to design integrated public services with a practical case.

The integrated e-Learning solution will consist of 2 main components:

- ✓ **Online Learning Course:** will deliver key knowledge and practical skills to implement the EIF recommendations;
- ✓ **Interactive Guide:** will enable instant access to all EIF information presented in the course for daily activities.

Structure of EIF Module

- ✓ Duration: 50 minutes
- ✓ 6 Modules
- ✓ The modules include:
 - PPT presentations
 - video animations 7-8'
 - a quiz at the end of each module
