Rethinking Semantic Interoperability - SEMIC.EU Yearly Conference 2011



Some 100 participants followed SEMIC.EU's invitation for "Rethinking Semantic Interoperability Through Collaboration". In a full-day conference, they discussed their ideas at the Centre Albert Borschette in Brussels on 18th May.

Community and documentation

To follow up on this exchange of ideas, cases and strategic orientation, a community has been opened at SEMIC.EU to follow up on the conference results. All speakers' presentations are available here, including the keynote talks by Brand Niemann and Stefan Decker.

Final report

SEMIC.EU has also published a final report summarizing statistical data of the conference and giving a highlight overview of all speakers' contributions as well as the panel discussion. Federation and Core Concepts


Among the most important tasks for SEMIC.EU are the further development of the Core Concepts and the federation efforts with ADMS (see news item below).

Federation Prototype - your comments welcome

First presented at the SEMIC.EU Yearly Conference on 18th May, a prototype federation of repositories is now ready for exploration.



Access: Federated Portal of Repositories on Semantic Interoperability Solutions

Based on the Assed Description Metadata Schema currently under development within the community, the prototype allows access to asset repositories in Denmark and Germany as well as SEMIC.FU.

It was developed in cooperation with DERI (the Digital Enterprise Research Institute in Galway, Ireland) and can be accessed via the ADMS community page.

Europass XML Schema V2.1 The Europass XML Schema V2.1 is a working draft for providing an updated XML schema definition for the Europass XML documents.

Access to Biological Collection Data (ABCD) The Access to Biological Collections Data (ABCD) Schema is an evolving comprehensive standard for the access to and exchange of data about specimens and observations (a.k.a. primary biodiversity data).

Accused Status This list of terms specifies the current status of the accused.

agroXML agroXML is used to descibe the attributes and relations of processes in the agricultural context.

XML structures for personal data This XML structure shall be used in Austrian eGovernment applications to structure personal data.


