Reduce costs through reuse of interoperability assets.



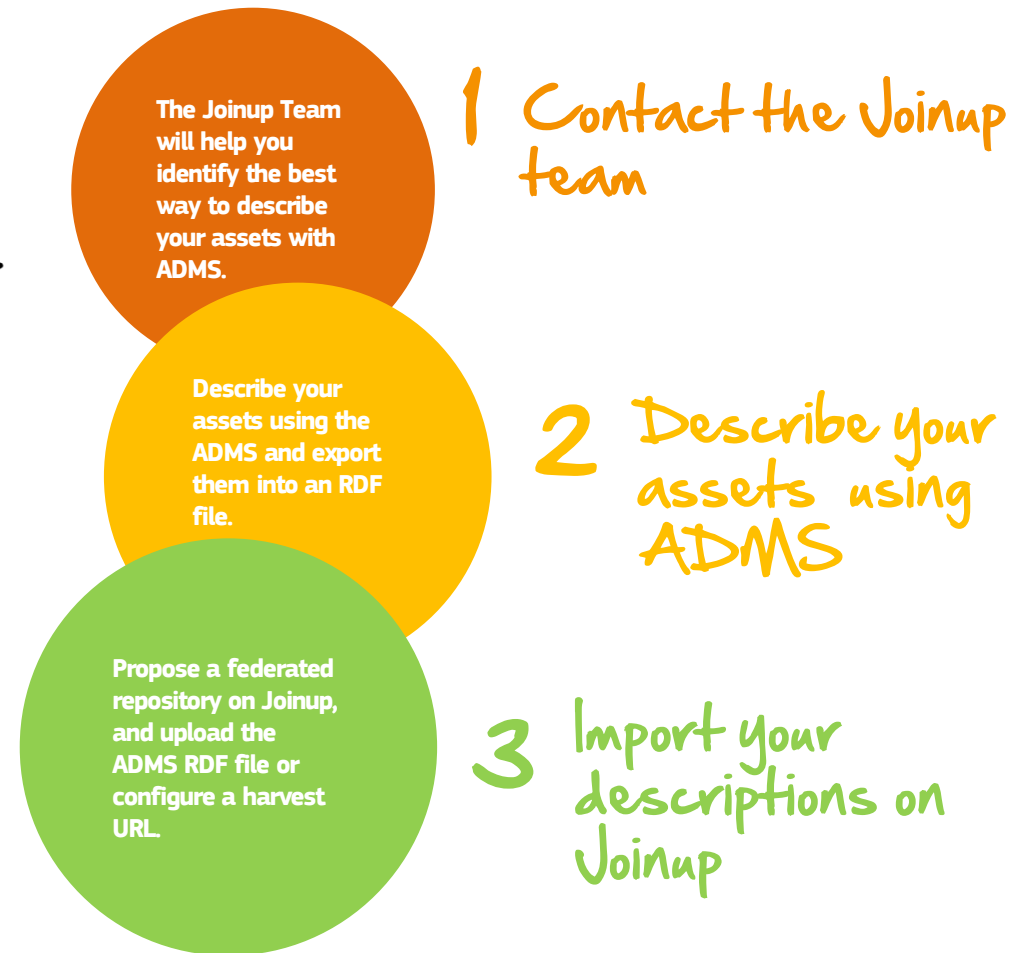
