INTEROPERABILITY & INTEROPERABLE PUBLIC SERVICES

Cross-border interoperability

The eID.li system was designed from the outset to be interoperable with other European eID systems. It must therefore meet the technical, organisational, and procedural security requirements in accordance with Regulation (EU) No. 910/2014 of the European Parliament and of the Council of 23 July 2014 on electronic identification and trust services for electronic transactions in the internal market.

Digital-ready policymaking

At the end of 2022, the transition period of the e-government law on digital communication between public authorities and businesses and public authorities expired. Since 01.01.2023, digital communication between public authorities and enterprises and public authorities is mandatory. Exceptions have been included in the online order.

In recent years, a major project (Digital Roadmap liechtensteinische Landesverwaltung - DiRoLL) has been implemented to identify and partially implement digitization processes and systems. All departments of the National Administration are involved.

DATA SHARING



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Data exchanges with and within public administrations

In 2022, a project (eGov OGD Portal) was launched with the aim of establishing a central portal at national level where existing public data can be published. Various formats, including machine-readable formats, are available for obtaining the data. Each data provider is responsible for fulfilling its publication obligation.

The first version of the OGD platform is to be implemented by the end of 2024. In addition, a total revision of the law on the reuse of public sector information was initiated in 2022.
