The course also gives insights on the opportunities that can be leveraged to identify the appropriate interoperability modules for the implementation of the services reusing existing interoperable solutions.






### **Target audience**

- Provide the definition of interoperability identify / describe the main European Interoperability Framework concepts the main enablers and the main barriers for achieving interoperability.
- Articulate the need for Interoperability and how the concepts of the European Interoperability Framework and respective initiatives facilitate the implementation of significant legal acts for cross border services in the European Economic Area.
- Identify, locate, assess, reusable tools and participate to communities that accelerate the creation of the interoperable public services and develop the required advanced digital skills.





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## Introduction

The objective of this course is to offer a comprehensive understanding of interoperability that addresses why it is necessary, the context of interoperability at a high level and the initiatives of the European Commission in this regard.

This introductory interoperability course consists of four sections, followed by a final assessment containing ten questions.

Upon successful completion of the course, students will be able to:

- Provide a definition of the term "interoperability" by citing and describing the main concepts of the European Interoperability Framework, the main enabling elements and the main obstacles in achieving interoperability.
- Explain why interoperability is necessary and how the concepts of the European Interoperability Framework and corresponding initiatives facilitate the implementation of important legal acts for cross-border services in the European Economic Area.
- Select, localize and evaluate reusable tools and participate in communities that accelerate the creation of interoperable public services and develop the necessary advanced digital capabilities (i.e. the National Interoperability Frameworks Observatory, JoinUp, the Open Source Observatory and Repository, the modules of the Connecting Europe Facility and the Interoperable Europe Academy).
