A <u>new programme</u> has been established by the Ministry of Health, for the period 2022-2027. The key points of this programme are to create, deliver, develop and maintain secure IT solutions for the healthcare system that meet the needs of users.

The <u>Digital Competence Development Program</u> was adopted by the Council of Ministers in early 2023. The Programme is a comprehensive and multiannual document diagnosing the status of digital competences in Poland and containing planned activities in this area addressed to specific groups (pre-school children, students, teachers, employees, entrepreneurs, etc).

Given the growing interest in mObywatel (mCitizen) enforcement, it was decided to draft new legislation to improve the regulations. The bill was the subject of internal consultations and interdepartmental agreements, as well as public opinions and consultations. In 2022, the project was adopted.

In 2022, the mObywatel app made available the service Diia.pl, thanks to which Ukrainian citizens who arrived in Poland from 24 February 2022, and whose stay in Poland has been recognized as legal, can confirm their identity in the EU. This <a href="mailto:cross-border initiative">cross-border initiative</a> allows Ukrainian citizens to download personal data from a dedicated registry, store it in encrypted form on their mobile device and present it to others to confirm their identity.

In May 2023, after the reorganisation of the government, the Ministry of Digital Affairs was separated from the Chancellery of the Prime Minister.
