Open-source Commission strategy

Adopted on 21 October 2020

• 'Wherever possible and appropriate, the Commission would share the source code for any computer programs where it holds the intellectual property rights on behalf of the EU'

Framework for distributing open-source software

- The default open-source license should be the European Union Public License (EUPL)
- The steps to open-source distribution include
 - Software identification process
 - Intellectual Property clearance
 - Vulnerability assessment
